In this institute participants explore social studies and language arts in an integrated, thematic approach. The class addresses reading and writing for argument through guiding questions, as well as reading and writing narrative and poetry. Teachers will leave with inquiry and discussion skills to take to the classroom. Instructional strategies are in line with best practices for inquiry learning and the Common Core standards.
